

WE ARE CELEBRATING THE 70TH YEAR since Israel became a nation. Around the world Christians and Jews are praising God for Israel. The Hallel (praise) Psalms (113–118) are read as part of this praise to God. In Psalm 113 God is praised in part for how He cares for the needy. "Who is like the LORD our God, who dwells on high, who humbles Himself to behold the things that are in the heavens and in the earth? He raises the poor out of the dust, and lifts the needy out of the ash heap" (Ps. 113:5–7).

In the midst of the celebrations, there are many in Israel burdened with needs. Holocaust survivors, immigrants, children from broken homes, lone soldiers (here without family support), elderly and mourners all have something in common. They need our loving care.

Miriam is a new immigrant who receives food from Bridges for Peace. She wrote to us:

## Dear Bridges for Peace,

I came to Israel with my two sons and it was like moving to another planet. We did not have any relatives or acquaintances in Israel. It was frightening to realize we knew very little about the country we moved to.

But all glory to God, almost immediately you came into our lives, people who were ready to help us and to support us. And thanks to you we very soon felt at home! You gave us huge assistance for me with my two sons.

My difficult factory job left me feeling disconnected from my kids and I felt like I was wasting my time and strength. For a very long time I worked on jobs I did not like just to provide

for my family and it did not leave me time nor strength to realize my dreams.

I am now improving my Hebrew and making my first steps in a new profession, sewing beautiful clothes for my friends and for myself. It is such happiness to bring people beauty and joy!

Telling the truth, I would not have the courage to make this step if I was not sure that there are people helping me. Thank you very much and I wish you a lot of strength in such a noble job!
